According to the evaluation of UG program, the Contribution of for internal assessment is 25% and for end semester exams is 75%.

Internal Assessment : 20% of IA is evaluated by taking the best of the two mid exams and 5% of IA is based on continuous assessment of a students overall performance and attendance in each semester.

Attainment level COs for both IA and ESE are based on the threshold value (TV). If greater than 60% students obtained TV then the attainment level of CO is 3.

If between 55%-60%, students obtained TV then the attainment level of CO is considered as 2. If less than 55% students obtained TV then the attainment level of CO is considered as 1.
