### ${\bf 15. Multidisciplinary}\ /\ interdisciplinary$

The NEP 2020 introduces a holistic & multidisciplinary curriculum

that aims to provide superior education that contribute to nation building through advancement of human resource. This concept is well executed by our institution. Faculty members were encouraged to have brainstorming sessions to discuss about the key ideology of NEP such as multi-disciplinary &holistic development. Under Graduate education with flexible curriculum, creative combinations of subjects, integration of vocational education, multiple entry and exit points with appropriate certification and the integration of humanities and science with STEM and its combination courses. As our institution is an affiliated college, the course structure and the content for academic teachinglearning is designed by the affiliating university as per the UGC guidelines. Our parent university is also working on the successful implementation of vocational, interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary education which will certainly facilitate our students to be more competent and employable. In the coming days while we will get more clarity on how the new concept of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education policy gets shaped up, the academic structure of the college can be altered accordingly to affiliating university. The institution offers many career oriented/industry driven add on courses whose curriculum and assessment frame work is designed by the faculties.

#### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As a college affiliated to Andhra University Visakhapatnam, the institution follows the curriculum stipulated by the University. The Choice based credit Semester system (CBCS) does not have the flexibility to permit the learners to avail the benefit of multiple entries and exits during the chosen programme where as NEP gives the flexibility to do so and hence the College is now registered under Academic Bank of Credits. Institution is registered under Academic Bank of Credits and is strategizing on the requirement and registration under NAD DigiLocker. However, the students have a provision to continue studies and carry on to next semester in spite of a backlog. Also, student can migrate from one college to another college during the course of study with the permission of the affiliating university. Institution has put its joint efforts for seamless collaboration. The institution offers many career oriented/industry driven add on courses whose curriculum and assessment frame work is designed by the faculties. Faculties are also encouraged to design their own curricular and pedagogical approaches within the approved framework through learning management system. Students are encouraged to enroll and successfully complete courses through

online platforms such as Swayam, Coursera etc.

### 17.Skill development:

Skill development in the college plays a pivotal role in shaping a student's career and personal growth. College provides a foundation for acquiring both academic knowledge and practical skills necessary for the competitive job market. Beyond theoretical learning, UG programs emphasize developing critical skills like communication, problem-solving, teamwork, and leadership. Institution often facilitate workshops, internships, and industry collaborations to bridge the gap between academics and real-world applications. Technical skills, including proficiency in tools and software relevant to a student's field, are encouraged through lab sessions and projects. Additionally, college organizes extracurricular activities, seminars, and student clubs to foster creativity, adaptability, and interpersonal skills. Career counseling and placement cells guide students in choosing the right career paths, preparing resumes, and performing well in interviews. Our college also promotesvsoft skill development through public speaking forums, language labs, and personality development programs. In today's dynamic world, skill development is essential for holistic growth and employability. College on nurturing grounds, empower students to excel not just academically but also professionally, ensuring they are well-equipped to face future challenges.

### 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Integrating the Indian knowledge system not only preserves and respects the cultural heritage of the nation but also nurtures a sense of pride and identity among students. The institution has taken significant strides in integrating Indian Knowledge Systems into its academic programs. Situated in Andhra Pradesh, where Telugu is the vernacular language, the college employs both Telugu and English for teaching, learning, and communication purposes. The institution offers courses in Telugu, Sanskrit and Hindi as part of its undergraduate programs, emphasising the importance of regional, Cultural and national languages. Practicing Yoga is a integral part of the tradition followed by our students. Additionally, it embraces India's cultural diversity by commemorating various cultural and traditional festivals and events such as Hindi Divas, Telugu Bhasa Dinotsavam, Ethnic Day, Vasanta Panchami, Ganesh Chathurthi and Ugadi. The department of History organises programs that explore Indian arts, culture and tradition. Students participate in cultural events organised by

the students union which creates awareness of the diversity of our culture. Performance of traditional art forms in various college events. Field projects are conducted focusing on traditional medical system, ethnomedicine, folklore literature, local history etc. Courses like Ethnobotany, Indian history, early Indian literature, etc are included in the curriculum. Wherever possible the contribution of Indian thinkers and their works are delivered to students, as part of the curriculum itself. Institution organises field trips to historical sites. The students are encouraged to relate to nature as the Indian system of learning was rooted in closeness to nature. The classes are conducted in open spaces wherever possible and the field trips and nature camps help the students to acquire knowledge by exploring nature.

The outcome is set to develop basic life skills, vocational skills, intellectual skills and interpersonal skills. The outcome is transferred to the students through careful Analysis of the syllabus and through effective exercise of faculty and self creating activities. The activities of each department is focussed on the overall skill development and the students are encouraged to involve actively in all the academic and non-academic activities inside the college. The college provides various platforms to develop the communication and interpersonal skills with the help of Debate, Elocution, quality circle and quiz along with NSS activities. Students of the institution have won multiple awards in debates, elocutions, extempers, and other competitions held by other colleges. . All the science Departments provide first hand laboratory experience and all the departments provide 6 months training for project preparation and presentation strictly bounded to course structure but on the most relevant and updated area. The emotional intelligence of each student is deeply observed and give strong support to develop self awareness and empathy by giving mentoring and counselling sessions. The level of attainment of Couse Outcomes were measured via structured mechanisms such as internal and external evaluation in association with feedback forms. We

strategize the Outcome Based Education to create achievable goals while the students are free to choose the goals to be short term or long term. B.V.K College aims at the holistic Development of our students' mind, body and spirit as our best practice.

#### 20.Distance education/online education:

The college has been conducting regular classroom teaching employing ICT enabled tools. The year 2020-21 forced the academic community to shift to online mode of teaching-learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. To enable the teachers to adapt to online mode, a training programme was conducted in 2020 'Introduction to e- connect, e-learning and e-content tools'. Following the training, the teachers could shift effectively to the online mode. The internet facility of the college was upgraded. Along with live classes, recorded lectures were given and students are encouraged to attend NPTEL courses and the technical support required for the same was given by each department.

QAC has been instrumental in implementing quality assurance of the institution by conducting internal and external academic and administrative audit and student satisfaction survey for the year.

The internal academic audit was conducted from 26-30 May, 2024 by IQAC Criteria wise. The College Management and Principal has been meeting and evaluating teaching and non-teaching staff regularly on academic and administrative matters. These help in self-evaluation and analyse the strength and weakness of each faculty and department. The participation in NIRF helps to assess the
